Games, challenges and group work forming majority of our maths lessons. This love of learning, particularly in maths was reinforced in the video you saw on Tuesday.

During week one and two, 2-6M looked at and played lots of 'games'. We had a lot of fun playing games that the kids brought in, but we also had a lot of discussion around rules of games. As I previously mentioned, a busy term ahead. We'll continue on our unit of Australia, looking more closely at Dreamtime Stories, Australian animals, classic songs and even some old dance.
