Principal's News

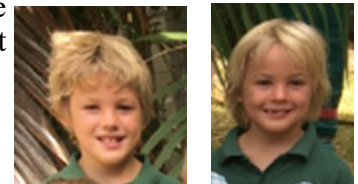

Book Week Book Swap

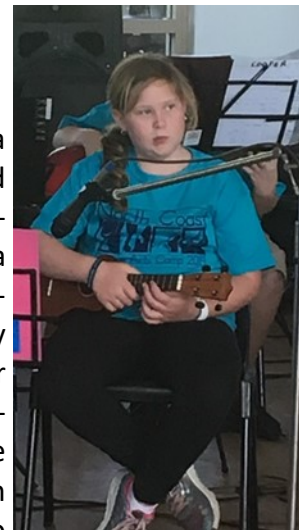
