### Reports

Student reports are being finalised and will be available Week 10. Students on individualised programs will have semester 2 meetings with teachers' early term 3, to review progress and plan for the rest of the year. Semester 2 reports will contain a section completed by the students about their learning and their reflection on their goals and challenges.

The school was given a small amount of money/ funding this year to support student learning because of the disrupted school year last year. During Semester 1 we used this money to employ Sheridan Turner to work with the Year 2's in literacy. This choice was made due to the critical nature of year 1 and learning and the disruption these students had. This will continue for the second half of the year. We have seen pleasing growth from the students in this program. We are currently using school funding to support other students who have also been impacted on by a disruptive 2020.

### Leave

Thank you to the families that have used the leave application process for their absences during the winter months. If you are unsure how to complete these forms please contact me, either by phone or email, and I can assist you with completing them in To date no one has been declined. Being an isolated community there are many reasons why this travel would be acceptable, including access to cultural, educational, and sporting activities that are not

available on the island and you are not able to access at any other time. Thank you to the families who have combined their appointments with school holidays to minimise impact on their child's education. For every day your child is absent it will take them 3 days to catch up on missed learning. Over a year if they miss 2 weeks of school they will need 6 weeks to make up the lost learning and engage in current learning. Talk to us about how to minimise this impact when you need to travel.

### School Attendance

The year 3/4/5/6 students created some fantastic short videos on why attendance matters. I will be very pleased to share these with you. Am working on adding them to our school website. We are tracking attendance as it is a priority for our school. Students that fall below 90% attendance automatically are referred to Learning and Support. Students that fall below 95% are monitored by the teacher and the teacher will often contact them to discuss attendance. Should a child be away for a period of time and is well enough to complete some school work we encourage parents to contact the class teacher and get some reading and numeracy work.

### World Ocean's Day

World Oceans Day was an awesome day, the students participated in some great activities, including board game making, video making, mobile making and a photo competition. Thank you to Emily Riddle and Caitlin Wood for their support of this event. Thank you to all the families who have supplied photos at short notice. It is a priority of the school to be involved in the wider community and we seek opportunities from all areas of the community to be actively involved. It is through this involvement that we educate our children who will be the custodians of the island in the future.

New books coming into the library have allowed us to allocate sets of books to the classrooms to be used for home reading, kindergarten to year 6.
